The schedules and frequency of participation are flexible.

Communion Returning to Communion Rail

We are returning to using the Communion rail May 1 st

There are two key changes:

1. At the direction of the usher, you will fill out a "table" at the communion rail with approximately 9 other worshipers from your side of the church.

2. The usher will alternate sides of the church for each table rather than commune everyone on the lectern side before communing the Pulpit side.

Ushers will direct a group of 10 or less people to the Communion rail, alternating each side of the Sanctuary. It is your choice to kneel or stand.

The presiding minister will distribute the bread or wafer. The first communion assistant will have grape juice, and the second assistant will have the wine.

Please hold out your cup to the assistant with your choice for fruit of the vine.

Once all in the table have communed, the second assistant may dismiss the table. The central usher will then guide the next table while the minister and communion assistants commune the table on the other side of the nave.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

So what do we do now?

Bethany has chosen as its mission statement our Lord's Great Commission from Matthew 28 — "Go therefore into all the world and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." That is our Lord's answer to the question of what we do next, since it is what he told his disciples as he gathered them after Easter and before he ascended to the Father. I like to point out that it is not accidental that the words "disciple" and "discipline" have the same linguistic root. A disciple is not a fan or follower (in the social media sense) of Jesus, but one who is serious about "observing all that I have commanded you." A disciple of Jesus is one engaged in the discipline of growing every day to discover exactly what it is that God has done for them when they were baptized into the Triune Name of God. Since the Great Commandment is to "love one another," discipleship never happens in isolation from the Body of Christ. One who deliberately abandons the fellowship of other Christians simply is not acting in love toward those others, and is not obeying "all that I have commanded you." We need one another to grow as disciples, just as a coal removed from a fire will quickly be extinguished.

Megan is starting her internship with us this month, and she brings many gifts. One is that she comes out of a solid disciple-making congregation. She has been mentored and taught by pastors and others who have track records of effective disciple-making in congregations they have served. If you sense God calling you to grow into a deeper walk with him, I suggest you sit down with Megan and ask for her advice of how to begin. Hers will not be a "normal" internship (what in the church is "normal" anyhow, especially post-Covid?). I plan to offer her an internship much as the one I experienced, in which I was given primary pastoral responsibility for two congregations in Sugar Valley, while my supervisor served elsewhere most of the time. Since I live 2 hours away, I would suggest that you make Megan the first person you call for pastoral care. She will carry the full authority of the pastoral office at Bethany as she will represent me as interim pastor in whatever she does. The only things she cannot do are officiate at weddings (by state law) and (at least at this time) consecrate elements for Holy Communion. I plan to be at Bethany regularly to lead worship, conduct visitations (often along with Megan), and participate in most Church Council meetings. And you are certainly welcome to call or contact me for anything you might want or need from me. I hope you are as excited as I am about this new chapter at Bethany, as Megan will be sharing her gifts and experience with us for a year and we will be helping her hone those gifts for future ministry. Please keep Bethany, Megan, and me in your prayers, and continue to pray for whoever it is that God plans to call to be the next "permanent" pastor at Bethany.
