

Message from Rev. Steve Shipman

I'm writing this on the day of the summer solstice, which means that summer officially has begun. Of course, it also means the days will slowly grow shorter, but since time seems to be speeding up for me anyhow (my grandfather warned me about that long ago), I probably won't notice. The pastors at my congregation have noted publicly that they do NOT combine services or eliminate Sunday School during these months, although they do combine some classes to ease the load on teachers. And I believe they are wise. Most of these Sundays the color of the paraments on the altar and pulpit is green, which is the color of growth. But how can we grow as disciples of Jesus if we don't gather with the saints around the Word and the Sacraments? Oh, yes, I would be a total hypocrite if I said that we should never do something else on Sunday morning. I had a lovely tour of the Everglades on a Sunday back in May, and this coming Sunday I will be with my fellow Lions in Montreal, doing activities of our International Convention. But I miss worshipping on those occasions, and I immensely enjoy visiting other congregations when I travel if that is possible. I encourage you when you travel to experience worship in other churches, and to bring a bulletin or worship folder (maybe even a newsletter) home and share it with us. We can learn from what others are doing in these "interesting" post-Covid times. But please do your best to join us on Sunday mornings here at Bethany. And for your own Christian growth, consider participating in our adult Sunday School classes. Christian growth is not just for children and youth, and it sets a marvelous example if they see us "mature" people also setting aside time to study the Word. We all can see the membership and attendance declines at Bethany. There are many factors, but simply wishing things might change won't do the trick. Let me offer a few suggestions: 1. Pray every day for God to renew our life together and raise up disciples. 2. Pray every day for God to guide the right pastoral leadership to serve Bethany. 3. Make Sunday worship and study a priority. 4. Create a loving, welcoming environment for everybody here (and if we want young families, that needs to include children). 5. Ask God how you can use the gifts He has given you to build up this congregation. I'm also going to take the liberty of adding a sixth one. As I read the treasurer's reports, I'm not sure it would be responsible for Bethany to call a full-time pastor given the current rate of income from offerings. I know many of you are very generous and are doing the best you absolutely can, and that is fine. But I would ask you to consider prayerfully your financial support of your church. It would be good to keep our endowment for the purposes it was given and not use it to pay ongoing expenses. And we aren't the government — we can't print more money if our resources run low. I believe that God has placed Bethany in a wonderful mission field, and that He has given and will give us everything we need to carry out the work to which we are called. How are you going to be a part of the good things God is doing through your church?

Harvest of Hope – Volunteer Opportunities & Fresh Free Veggies and Fruit

We are currently following the COVID-19 requirements. The Fresh Express program continues the second Thursday of every month; however, we distribute the food as cars drive by. We are currently supplying the schools with backpack food items to supplement weekend food.

Fresh Express is open every 2nd Thursday of the month from 3:00 PM - 5:00 PM.

Volunteers assist with this program every 2nd Thursday of the month from 1:00 PM - 5:30 PM utilizing 2 hour shifts for set up, sorting, distribution and clean up. The **Backpack program packs food every 3rd Thursday of the month from 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM** during the school year. The backpack supply team meets the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM. The backpack set up team meets every 3rd Tuesday of the month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM.

Harvest of Hope is now celebrating our fourth year! Although the dream and seed of this project began about 5 years ago, we could not have imagined the rate of its growth. The community involvement from the schools, organizations, businesses and churches has been a blessing. The stories that we have been privileged to hear warm our hearts! With that being said, we have a long way to go to meet the needs of the community. We are currently serving 120 students in the Montoursville School District with weekend supplemental food. We have approximately 550 students that qualify for this food. We are working on a financial plan to increase the number of students to meet this need. We serve approximately 75 families with our Fresh Express program. If you are interested in being part of helping financially please see "How to Help".

Our Backpack program is organized so that a child in need will receive one bag of food every Friday during the school year. In that bag they receive 2 entrees, 2 breakfast items, 1 vegetable, 1 fruit and 2 snacks along with a special item on holidays.

We have 12 churches committed to help us with food donations for the backpack program as it functions purely from donations. We are so blessed to have this community group effort. We have received food donations from school events and personal food donations. If you would like to donate please see "How to Help".

Our Fresh Express program receives a delivery of fresh and nutritious items in the morning from the Central PA Food Bank. We open our doors later that day for families to shop for their groceries. A hospitality team welcomes the families and provides them with snacks. The initial paperwork is completed as required by the State for statistics.

Thank you for your interest in the Harvest of Hope and we look forward to meeting you in some way in the future.
