Message from Vicar Megan Shaffer

Hello Beloved Bethany and Greetings to the Flock Beyond these Walls,

September is upon us. The children are heading back to school and I am among their ranks for what is, God willing, my final semester of seminary. Part of my final studies has been to read the entire bible. I am required to write brief summaries on each book, to write a few sermons on various topics (including translations of Hebrew and Greek) and to demonstrate my proficiency to my mentor group at Luther House of Studies. By the time my letter reaches you, I will have less than 20 books left to read. For this my beloved Bethany, I ask you to keep me in your prayers. Finishing this project by December will be a large undertaking for me. I will be finishing it while I also participate in two semester long classes. I'm trying my best to be hopeful and to not allow it to daunt me.

Many individuals throughout the bible were called by God to face tasks that were daunting and otherwise impossible without God. Moses for example argued with God, pointing out his own flaws in order to excuse himself from his call. Many others tried to walk away or tried to hide like Jonah. It took a few days in the belly of a whale to get Johan to become obedient. No matter how these men tried to run or excuse themselves from their call, God patiently stayed the course and equipped them to follow through with what He needed them to do. Both Moses and Jonah were formed into "God walkers," learning to seek out God's will for what they were called to do. Were they perfect at it? Certainly not. King David, was a man who walked with God and his story is full of flaws. Yet, because he trusted God, he went on to do amazing things, seeking out God's will and yes, admitting his wrongs when they happened and turning away from them. Ezra and Nehemiah also were "God Walkers."

Both Ezra and Nehemiah received calls from God to rebuild Jerusalem after it was leveled to the ground. When the initial group reached Jerusalem after a 300 mile journey, they found it burnt to the ground; a heap of rubble. After two years of work to set up towns around the city, the first remnant began the arduous task of going about to do what God called them to do, rebuild the temple. This group faced an arduous task and while they began laying the foundation, their work was already being thwarted as they encountered resistance. The evil one worked hard at causing frustration in order to stop the work. Two lawyers from a boarding area went to task against the Israelites by writing letters to the king concerning the "rebuilding (of) that rebellious and wicked city" and the dishonor it will bring to the king. King Artaxerxes was a wise man, rather than make a hasty decision he requests the work cease.

For years the Israelites waited patiently for permission to resume their work. Artaxerxes dies and now Darius, King of Persia is in command. Zerubbabel and Jeshua take up the task of rebuilding the house of God in Jerusalem having the prophets of God to help them (paraphrase). As the Israelites patiently wait God has Darius search the archives and the Israelites are given permission to resume the rebuilding of the temple and their advisories are given a warning to "keep away." They can finally go forward.

After many decades, toils and trials the temple is rebuilt, dedicated, offerings were made and the Passover is celebrated. Ezra the priest is instructed by the king to take the people back home to Jerusalem and to begin setting up their government. Not only do the Israelites return to Jerusalem, they also return to God by admitting their wrong doings of their ancestors and turning away from sinful behaviors. Yet the city is still in ruins and the wall is just a pile of stones. Without a wall to protect them, the people are exposed to great danger.

Hearing of the conditions of Jerusalem breaks the heart of Nehemiah, a cupbearer to the king. He prays to God for the sins of the past generations, begging God for his mercy. God hears his pleas and sends him to rebuild the city walls. Just like Ezra, Nehemiah is met with a task that seems impossible, yet God equips him with eager families who each sign on to take a portion of rebuilding the wall. He finds himself in the position of governor and is immediately met with opposition. As the work begins, once again, the evil one sets out to thwart the work. Yet, Nehemiah stands strong and firm in his mission. He knows it is God who will give the Israelites success in their project.

Through a series of trials, the Israelites work together, protecting one another and helping one another to rebuild. When enemies threat to attack, men stand with weapons to protect the workers. When people charge unfair interest on loans, Nehemiah sternly sets things right and deals with the criminals. Each time the enemy starts, God protected them, making them stronger and stronger. After an astounding 52 days the wall was completed and this terrified the enemies of Israel. When one reads of the rebuilding of Jerusalem, despite many trials, hope abounds.

I pray beloved Bethany, that we too can take hope from such a testimony as this. The world is attacking us right now for the evil one is always plotting against us. If we stand firm in the Lord, pray to Him, and seek his will, He will give us the strength we need to rebuild in ways He wants us to. Yes, covid knocked us down. Members scattered while your precious flock was without a pastor. Yet, don't lose hope. If God can call back the remnant of Israel to rebuild and to gather back up the scattered, He can do the same for us. With this, I encourage you to pray to Our Lord that He should reveal to us what future He has for us.

“For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.” (Jeremiah 29.11)

Message From Rev. Dennis Smith

Well, here it is my first contribution to Bethany's newsletter as the chair of the Worship and Music Committee. When I began worshipping here nearly a year ago, I figured that I would join the congregation, but I didn't anticipate becoming as involved as it turns out that I have mainly because of the distance of where I live with respect to Montoursville. I have only missed 4 Sundays since I began attending worship here. Not only have I been attending Sunday morning worship, I have helped in leading and preaching in the Divine Service, sung with the choir as well as a few solos, even played the organ on the First Sunday of Christmas, and leading taking turn in leading the adult Sunday School class. I have also been the delegate of the congregation to the Western Mission District's convocation back in June and the NALC's convocation (via Zoom) on August 5th. Then back in May I was nominated and voted in as chair of the Worship & Music Committee, which for me is important to be involved in the worship life of the Church.

It began back in my high school days when the pianist at my home church would not be attendance of worship. I had to start playing for worship services when she was not there and sometimes even for Sunday School if she was still a no-show. And then in my college years a deeper understanding of worship began to develop, especially as I began taking courses to prepare me for the ordained ministry. And then I was introduced and drawn to the liturgical worship within the Lutheran tradition.

I came to see "worship" as we human beings giving God, our Creator, His worth-ship - giving God praise and gratitude for what He has done for us in Christ Jesus, our Lord. I then understood worship as reception of the means of grace, not just Baptism and Holy Communion, but also confession & forgiveness, and the Word (in reading and preaching). But worship is not limited to Divine Service (Holy Communion or Eucharist) but also anytime the Christian is in prayer, praise, thanksgiving, and witness of his/her faith in Jesus. Worship is very central to the life of the Christian.

It is in the Divine Service where we as a community gather around the Word proclaimed and the sharing of the Sacrament of the Altar. The writer of the New Testament book of Hebrews writes, "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us now consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10.23-25 ESV). The writer makes it clear the importance of corporate worship in the life of the Christian. Yes we can worship God on our own BUT we still need our community of faith.

As chair of our Worship & Music Committee, I hope for us to examine the worship life of Bethany: What do we do well? What can we do better? What are we missing? We are already beginning to look at the prayer life of our congregation by examining our prayer list and how to not just pray for these people but looking at how to address their need in a better way.

I recently helped to oversee an updating of our sound system, including a second wireless microphone. Finally, I would like to say how much I am enjoying being a part of this congregation.

Harvest of Hope – Volunteer Opportunities & Fresh Free Veggies and Fruit

We are currently following the COVID-19 requirements. The Fresh Express program continues the second Thursday of every month; however, we distribute the food as cars drive by. We are currently supplying the schools with backpack food items to supplement weekend food.

Fresh Express is open every 2nd Thursday of the month from 3:00 PM - 5:00 PM.

Volunteers assist with this program every 2nd Thursday of the month from 1:00 PM - 5:30 PM utilizing 2 hour shifts for set up, sorting, distribution and clean up. The **Backpack program** packs food every 3rd Thursday of the month from 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM during the school year. The backpack supply team meets the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM. The backpack set up team meets every 3rd Tuesday of the month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM.

Harvest of Hope is now celebrating our fourth year! Although the dream and seed of this project began about 5 years ago, we could not have imagined the rate of its growth. The community involvement from the schools, organizations, businesses and churches has been a blessing. The stories that we have been privileged to hear warm our hearts! With that being said, we have a long way to go to meet the needs of the community. We are currently serving 120 students in the Montoursville School District with weekend supplemental food. We have approximately 550 students that qualify for this food. We are working on a financial plan to increase the number of students to meet this need. We serve approximately 75 families with our Fresh Express program. If you are interested in being part of helping financially please see "How to Help".

Our Backpack program is organized so that a child in need will receive one bag of food every Friday during the school year. In that bag they receive 2 entrees, 2 breakfast items, 1 vegetable, 1 fruit and 2 snacks along with a special item on holidays.

We have 12 churches committed to help us with food donations for the backpack program as it functions purely from donations. We are so blessed to have this community group effort. We have received food donations from school events and personal food donations. If you would like to donate please see "How to Help".

Our Fresh Express program receives a delivery of fresh and nutritious items in the morning from the Central PA Food Bank. We open our doors later that day for families to shop for their groceries. A hospitality team welcomes the families and provides them with snacks. The initial paperwork is completed as required by the State for statistics.

Thank you for your interest in the Harvest of Hope and we look forward to meeting you in some way in the future.

UNITED CHURCHES FOOD PANTRY


