What? Gathering for Prayer and Devotions from *In the Words of Jesus*.
Lead By: Seminarian Megan Shaffer
Where: In the Chapel
When: Noon each Wednesday in Lent
Dates: March 9th, 16th, 23rd, 30th, April 6th
Focus: Allowing time for all of us to reconnect with others since we have been separated for so long. We will read a short devotion; through discussion we will reflect on how the devotion speaks to our individual lives and experience renewal through prayer with each other. Length of time: an hour.

What: Soup & Salad Supper with Max Lucado's *Book Anxious for Nothing*Lead By: Seminarian Megan Shaffer
Where: Memorial Hall & the Chapel
When: Set up and arrival for Supper will begin at 5:30, with the Activities in the Chapel starting at 6:30.
Dates: March 9th, 16th, 23rd, 30th, April 6th
Focus: A time to gather as a community and share a simple supper. Each person or group is asked to sign up to bring an item to contribute to the supper. It can be a soup, salad, bread or even a dessert. We will begin with a prayer and will break bread together. After, we will travel to the Chapel to sing a hymn and study with Max Lucado's book *Anxious for Nothing* (short video and discussion). The book is a five week

study session focusing on how we can 'Find Calm in a Chaotic World.' We will end each gathering in prayer.
