A Few Words from Rev. Steve Shipman

A lot of good things are happening and are being planned at Bethany. I encourage you to focus on your spiritual growth, especially in these troubled times. There is so much uncertainty about world events, whether the missiles will start flying, and over the economy, as the inflation we were assured would not result from governmental policies is gobbling away at our financial resources.

Jesus warned us that things like this would happen in the time until he returns in glory, so we should not be dismayed. We are aliens and exiles on Earth, seeking a homeland which is permanent. And while we are here, we claim the promise of Jesus that as we serve and follow him, he is with us always, to the end of the age.

As Easter approaches during April, this is a good time to reflect on what Russell Kirk called "the permanent things." We worship Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday nights at 7 to prepare ourselves for the glorious Good News that Jesus is Risen. On Easter morning we celebrate our hope at 6 am (I hope there is plenty of coffee on hand) and 9 am. The services are different, and you are welcome at both.

Vicar Megan (although she won't be official until May 1) and I will be sharing preaching duties during Holy week. And I keep hearing how her Lenten Bible studies have been a great blessing to those who have participated. I look forward to our year working together for renewal at Bethany.

I wish I had some sort of encouraging news regarding a called pastor for Bethany, but at this point we (like all religious groups in North America) are swamped with retirements and have very few folks preparing for full-time ministry. "Pray to the Lord of Harvest to send laborers into His harvest."

God has a pastor for Bethany, He just hasn't told us (or that person) who it is yet.

Until then, we can all pray, study, and work together in the power of the Holy Spirit. We have the Word and the Sacraments, and we have the priesthood of all the baptized saints at Bethany. This is not a time to sit back but a time for everybody to step up to accept the responsibility of moving Bethany forward. And you will be far more attractive to any pastoral candidate if they can see a vital church moving forward under solid lay leadership.

Until then, please join us in celebrating the greatest truths of all — Jesus died for our sins, he rose with death forever behind him, and he is leading us into a more glorious future than any of us could imagine or deserve.
