MESSAGE FROM REV. STEVE SHIPMAN

As I look back on nearly half-a century of ordained ministry and three-quarters of a century of being involved in Lutheran churches, I have to ask, "What the heck happened?" Folks at Bethany recall setting up chairs in the aisle for Christmas and Easter, and I worshipped here more than once in Pastor Logan's day when you filled the church twice each Sunday. And it isn't just a Bethany problem. The Upper Susquehanna Synod just informed its congregations that it can no longer provide supply pastors every Sunday for all the churches that need them. As we baby boomer pastors (who once were told there weren't enough calls for all of us) retire or transfer to Heavenly realms, there are not nearly enough younger pastors coming along to replace us. Which shouldn't be surprising — there aren't all that many young people in our churches.

I hear all sorts of proposed solutions, ranging from "we need to hire a youth pastor" to "we should ditch the liturgy." The reality is that even churches that do that are only about a generation behind us, as the largest religious group among younger adults is "none," and that group is growing rapidly.

An article in Forum Letter put it this way: "They just aren't into us." That is true of increasing numbers of folks even in the more mature ages. I grew up in an era in which most people expected that they should participate in a church, even if they didn't show up often. In the 21st Century, people see no need to be part of churches even on Christmas and Easter.

Some of the perceived irrelevance of church and Christianity is our own fault. We have dumbed down preparation for church membership. We turned Christian formation over to the schools, and when the Supreme Court (correctly in my opinion) stopped the practice, we kept whining that "they took God out of our schools." I don't think it was the Supreme Court that took God out of our homes.

And we did not always convince the world that we are disciples of Jesus by our love for one another. We have too often majored in minors (does it really matter in what order the candles are lighted?). Or we have tried to appeal to people by entertaining them, when there is much better entertainment on the television set (or now computer screen) in their homes. First we need to recover a sense of awe and humility before God and before one another, so that people see our love and respond, "Surely the Lord is in this place." The reality of God alone can motivate people to abandon their "spiritual but not religious" lifestyles.

We Lutherans know that we cannot create faith in ourselves or in others; faith is the work of the Holy Spirit as He comes through the Word and the Sacraments. Just so, as we focus on the Word and the Sacraments we can trust that the Spirit of God blows the reality of God to us and creates faith as He makes Jesus real.

If the Spirit seems not to be at work among us as in the past, maybe we need to ask whether it was Jesus that brought us together back then. And it may not be a bad thing that the old church ways are dying. Our God has a track record of bringing life out of death.

As we look to the future of Bethany and of churches in every place, I urge that we resist simplistic answers and shallow solutions. This is a time to get back to the basics, and to trust God to work through His Word to glorify Jesus in our midst.

Harvest of Hope – Volunteer Opportunities & Fresh Free Veggies and Fruit

We are currently following the COVID-19 requirements. The Fresh Express program continues the second Thursday of every month; however, we distribute the food as cars drive by. We are currently supplying the schools with backpack food items to supplement weekend food.

Fresh Express is open every 2nd Thursday of the month from 3:00 PM - 5:00 PM. Volunteers assist with this program every 2nd Thursday of the month from 1:00 PM - 5:30 PM utilizing 2 hour shifts for set up, sorting, distribution and clean up. The Backpack program packs food every 3rd Thursday of the month from 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM during the school year. The backpack supply team meets the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM. The backpack set up team meets every 3rd Tuesday of the month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM.

Harvest of Hope is now celebrating our fourth year! Although the dream and seed of this project began about 5 years ago, we could not have imagined the rate of its growth. The community involvement from the schools, organizations, businesses and churches has been a blessing. The stories that we have been privileged to hear warm our hearts! With that being said, we have a long way to go to meet the needs of the community. We are currently serving 120 students in the Montoursville School District with weekend supplemental food. We have approximately 550 students that qualify for this food. We are working on a financial plan to increase the number of students to meet this need. We serve approximately 75 families with our Fresh Express program. If you are interested in being part of helping financially please see "How to Help".

Our Backpack program is organized so that a child in need will receive one bag of food every Friday during the school year. In that bag they receive 2 entrees, 2 breakfast items, 1 vegetable, 1 fruit and 2 snacks along with a special item on holidays.

We have 12 churches committed to help us with food donations for the backpack program as it functions purely from donations. We are so blessed to have this community group effort. We have received food donations from school events and personal food donations. If you would like to donate please see "How to Help".

Our Fresh Express program receives a delivery of fresh and nutritious items in the morning from the Central PA Food Bank. We open our doors later that day for families to shop for their groceries. A hospitality team welcomes the families and provides them with snacks. The initial paperwork is completed as required by the State for statistics.
